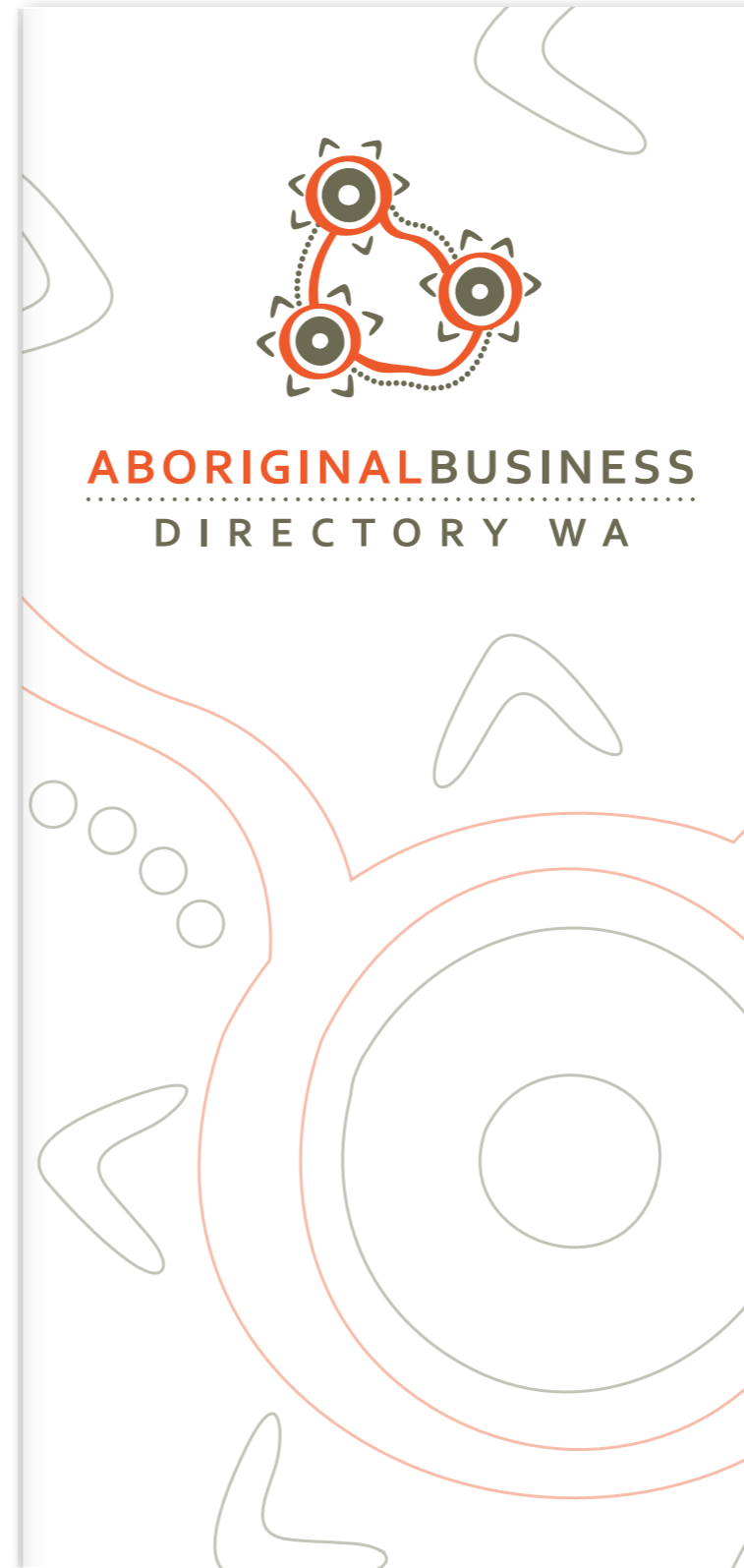

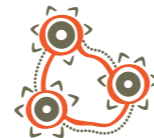

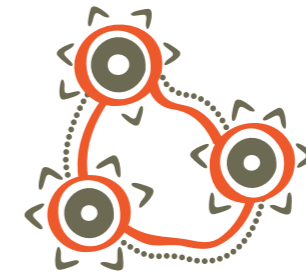

## WHY SHOULD I REGISTER ON THE ABDWA?

The benefits of being a part of this directory include:

- free to register;
- an opportunity to promote your business to buyers in government and non-government organisations at no cost to you;
- access to government buyers who use the ABDWA to directly buy goods and services worth up to \$250,000 without needing to seek quotes from other suppliers;
- your business can be easily found by buyers thanks to the ABDWA's facility to search by industry area and location;
- an opportunity to outline your capability and experience to potential buyers.

## IS MY BUSINESS ELIGIBLE?

### Fully operational

Your business must be established and fully operational as buyers using the directory users will want to buy goods or services immediately.

### Registered in WA

Ensure your business is registered in WA and that you have an Australian Business Number (ABN).

### Aboriginal interests

Make sure that at least 50 per cent of your business is owned by an Aboriginal interest and that the Aboriginal interests are represented in the management and operations of the business.

This means the person(s) must identify as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person, and be recognised by his or her community as a person who is of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent.

## HOW DO I REGISTER?

Register online at Aboriginal Business Directory WA [abdwa.com.au](http://abdwa.com.au)

Before starting the registration process make sure you have the following information to hand:

- a description of your goods or services and what your business can provide;
- where your business is located;
- current ABN number;
- current business name registration; and
- details of how many of your employees are Aboriginal.

You may find it useful to look at some of the businesses already registered on the directory and the type of information they have provided before you start registration.
